


Participant Simulation Scenario Handout: Suspect, Positive, and Palliative COVID-19 Resident Case

- 2. Practice donning and doffing PPE, including use of an observer.


Suspect, Positive, and Palliative COVID-19 Resident Case	
Resources	COVID-19 LTCF Response Protocol
Part 1 Goal:	To enhance the nursing coordinated clinical response to a resident experiencing COVID-19
symptom.	
Objectives	 Identify and respond to a resident's symptoms of COVID-19.
Scenario	11:00 on the day the resident's symptoms are identified. An HCA is walking with a resident with mild cognitive impairment (CPS=2/6) in the hallway near the resident room. The resident has a new onset of an occasional cough and sore throat. Vital signs are
	within normal ranges. Critical thinking: The resident is exhibiting symptoms of COVID-19.
Part 2 Goal: To enhance the nursing coordinated clinical response to a COVID-19 positive case.	
Objectives	1. Practice caring for a COVID-19 positive case for transfer to a cohort unit.
Scenario	10:00 next day after the onset of COVID-19 symptoms.
	The resident's status remains stable. Continued coughing and a "sore throat." Vital signs are within normal ranges. The NP result is positive. The care team prepares the resident for transfer to a cohort unit.
Part 3 Goal: To enhance the nursing coordinated clinical response to a COVID-19 LTC deceased resident	
and transport to a funeral home.	
Objectives	Practice caring for a COVID-19 palliative care resident.
Scenario	09:00 Resident temperature increased to 38° C, SaO2-85%, short of breath, respirations =6/min and not easily aroused.
	Critical thinking: Resident condition palliative. Scenario continues: 21:00 Resident is deceased and transport to the funeral home is to be arranged.
